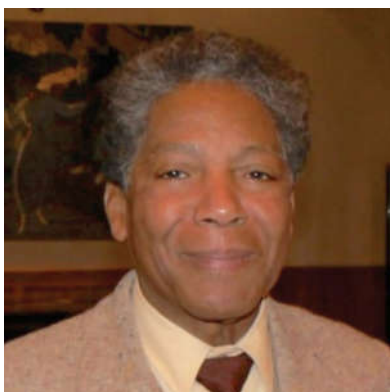


IN MEMORIAM
Hugues MONROSE
1936 - 2017



Hugues Monrose died peacefully at home in Othis, France, on October 20, 2017, at the age of 80.

Hugues Monrose was a retired petroleum engineer who dedicated his life to geology.

He graduated from IFP School (formerly ENSPM) in Rueil-Malmaison, he also had a Masters in Geology from Bordeaux University.

Between 1967 and 2002 he worked for Samega, Geoservices, and BEICIP.

He assumed the position of wellsite geologist responsible for managing teams, and as a petroleum engineer managed rigs and teams for Shell.

He also worked as a specialist in clastic petrography and as a petrophysicist. Later, he was manager of the BEICIP geochemical laboratory and simultaneously worked as a log analyst.

He applied his expertise worldwide, Pertamina (Indonesia) to ENAP (Chile).

He was Operations Coordinator in Nigeria and Equatorial Guinea.

He developed a keen interest in Russian logs and became an expert on the subject.

He also gave well-logging lectures at the University of Bordeaux.

Hugues Monrose was President of SAID, the French chapter of SPWLA, for four years and received the SPWLA award in 1999.

He was the founding member of the French Federation of Geology and a former member of the French National Committee of Geology.

Hugues is survived by his daughters Marguerite, Charlotte and Claire; his sons Joël and Patrick, and his seven grandchildren; his loving siblings, nieces and nephews.
